THE UPSTATE NY GAMING AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ACT: PROJECTIONS OF NEW REVENUE FOR SCHOOL AID, PROPERTY TAX RELIEF, LOCAL GOVERNMENT AID AND JOB CREATION

WESTERN NEW YORK AND FINGER LAKES REGION

The Upstate New York Gaming Economic Development Act authorizes up to four gaming facilities in upstate New York and enhances the revenue distribution of existing upstate Indian Tribal gaming facilities.

Under the Act, regardless of location, all regions will receive allocation for additional school aid, property tax relief, and local government aid. Western New York's region's share is estimated at \$93 million, and 10,000 jobs are projected to be generated upstate.
